That is where the Inuit would leave a loved one grown too old and feeble to care for anymore—without endangering the welfare of all. If an anthropologist asked why, the reply would be: "This is a natural and loving way to say goodbye, our culture simply lacks the resources to extend life further."

Sometimes I wonder what I will say when the next anthropologist asks why our culture also leaves its old and infirm on ice floes, to drift away.
