This is a poem about repetition, about repetition as a poetic device, about repetition as an effective poetic device when used with purpose—when used, that is, with purpose and (we should add) with some skill.

Used with a purpose and with some skill repetition can be an effective poetic device. But don't overdo it. And do try to introduce a little variation too at least once in a while since often that element of variation when introduced once in a while will make your repetition even more effective: more effective because it has become a bit less repetitive.

And of course never repeat just for its own sake

Let's say that again to stress its importance:
Never repeat just for its own sake,

any more than you want to rhyme
just for its own sake.
Rhyme only when the right time
arrives, and in a way that seems natural.
Likewise, for your sake
and for that of your readers
only use repetition
when it serves a proper purpose.

In short: Use repetition, but for goodness sake do it with a purpose.

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
